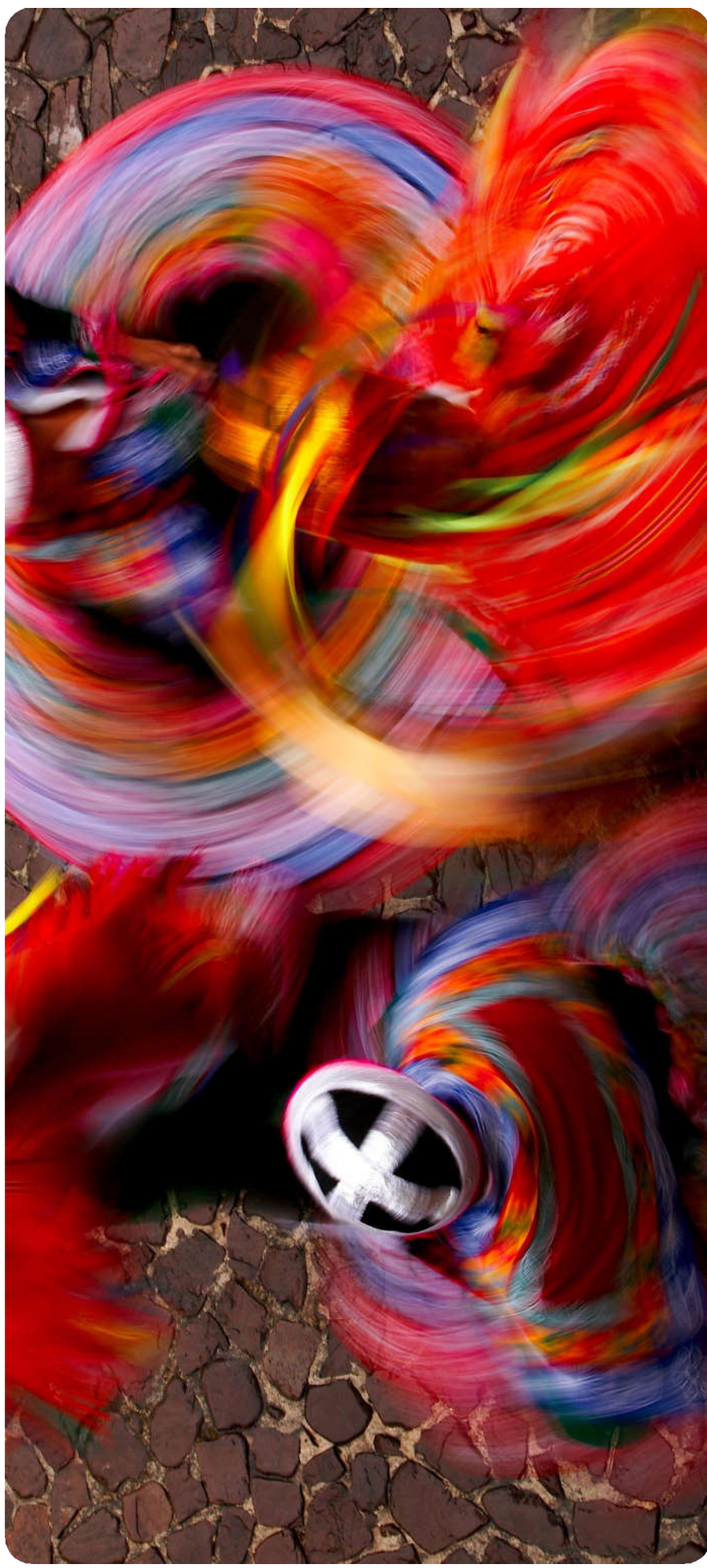

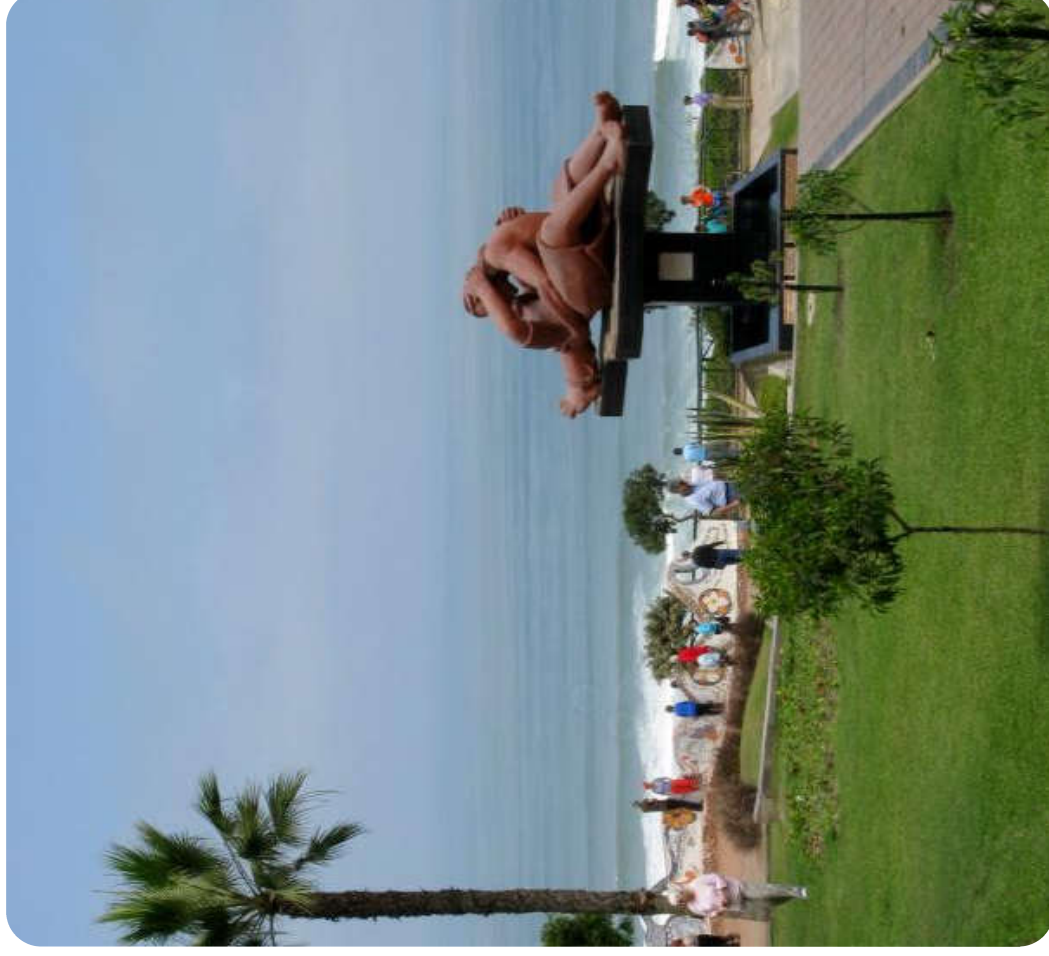

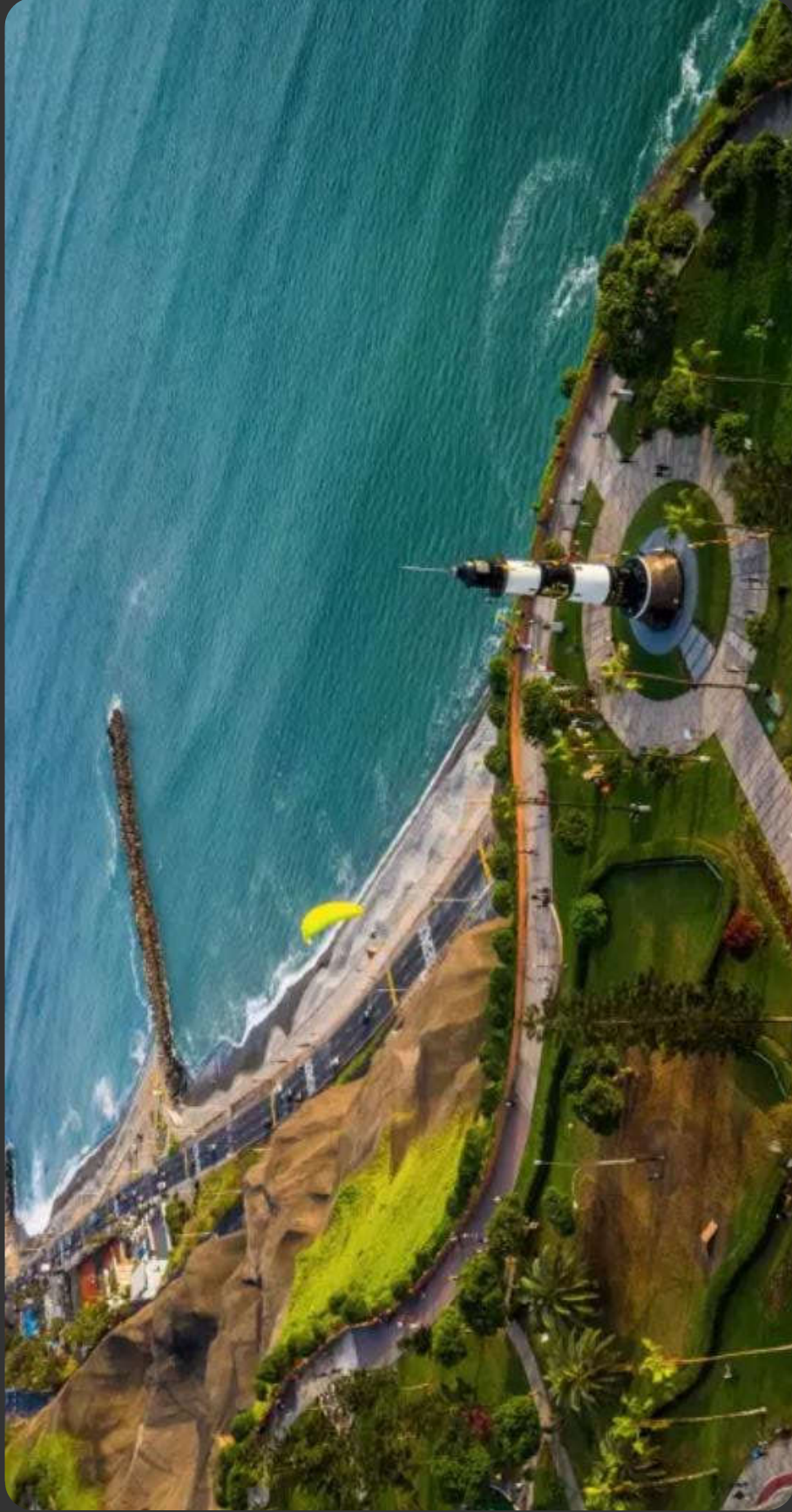

Miraflores & Barranco Tour

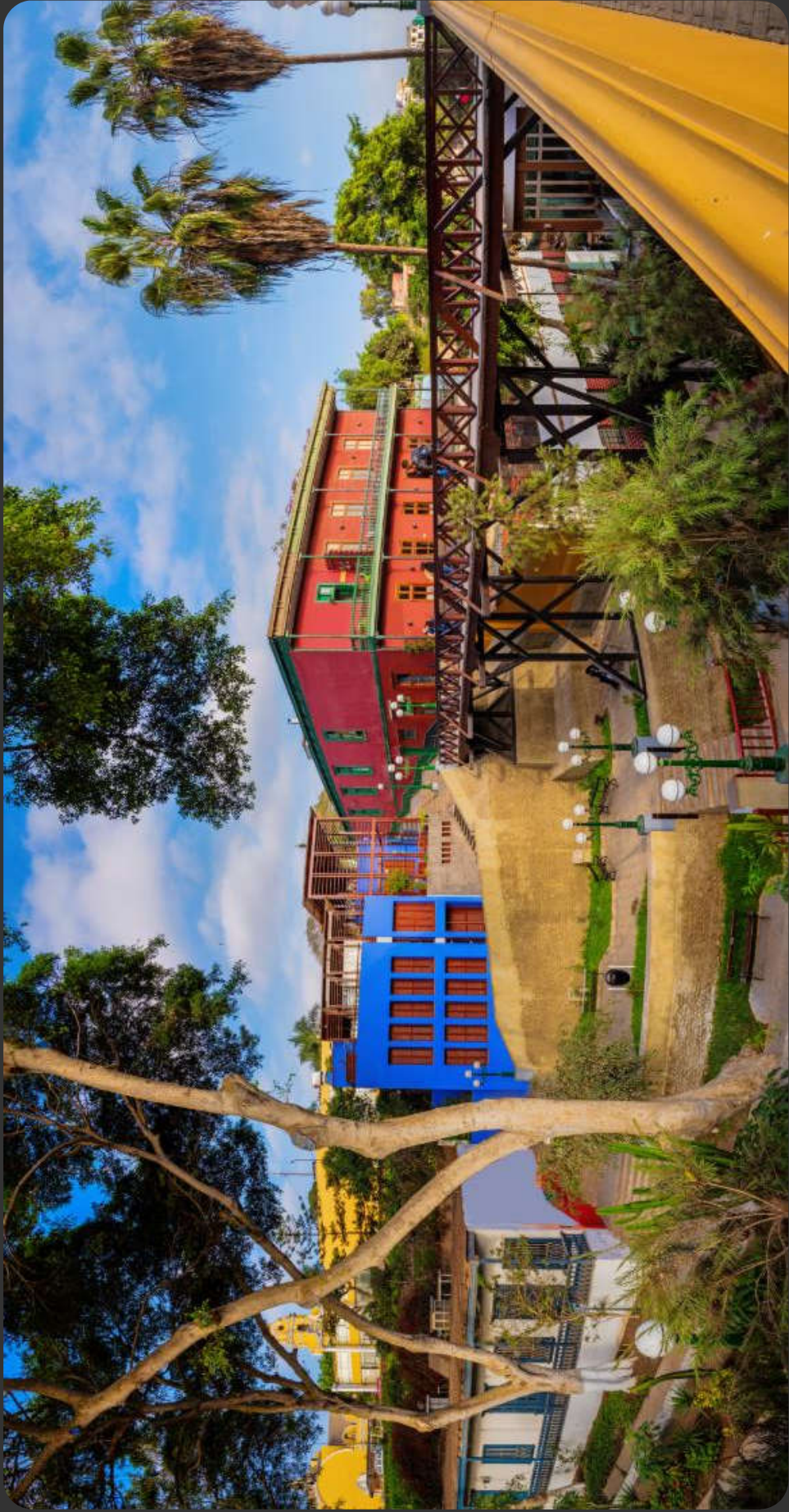
A tour through Miraflores and Barranco offers a perfect mix of history, culture, and ocean views. The day begins in Miraflores with a visit to Parque Kennedy, where travelers can experience local life and see the famous cats. From there, the walk continues along the Malecón, a scenic cliffside path overlooking the Pacific Ocean, passing Parque del Amor and enjoying panoramic coastal views.

Later, the tour heads south toward Barranco, Lima's bohemian district, known for its colorful streets, art galleries, and creative atmosphere. 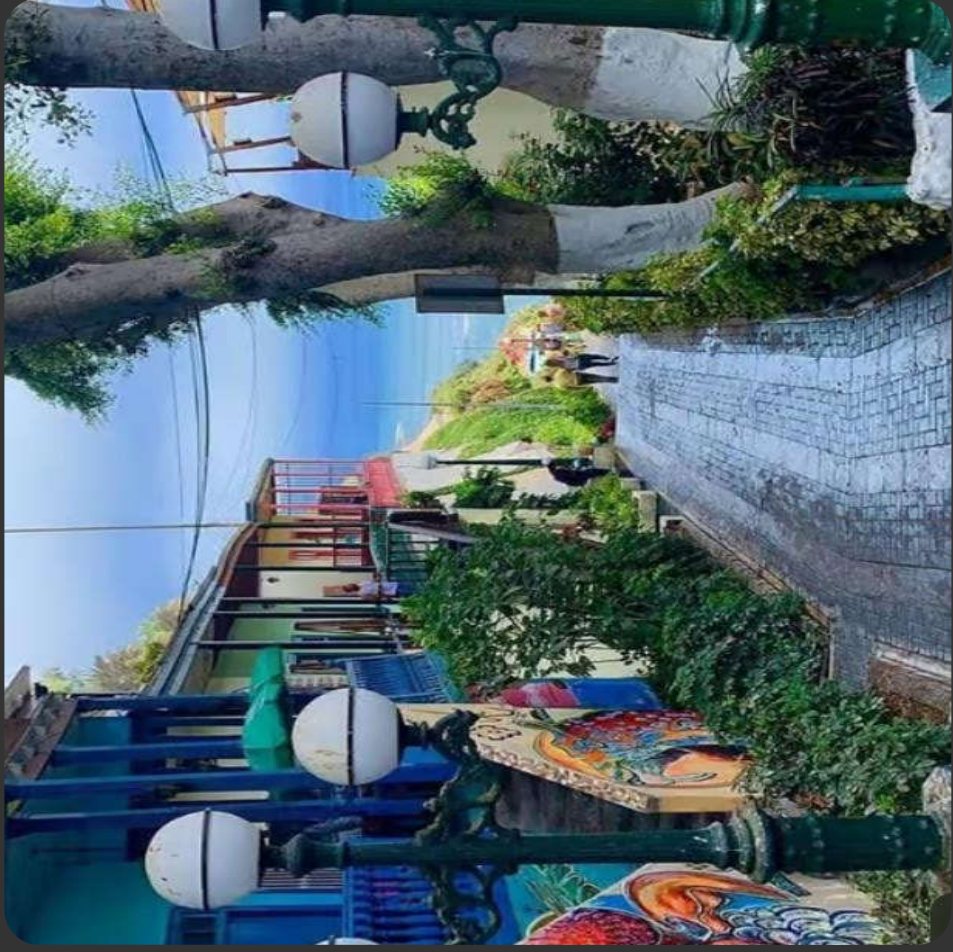




Miraflores neighborhood

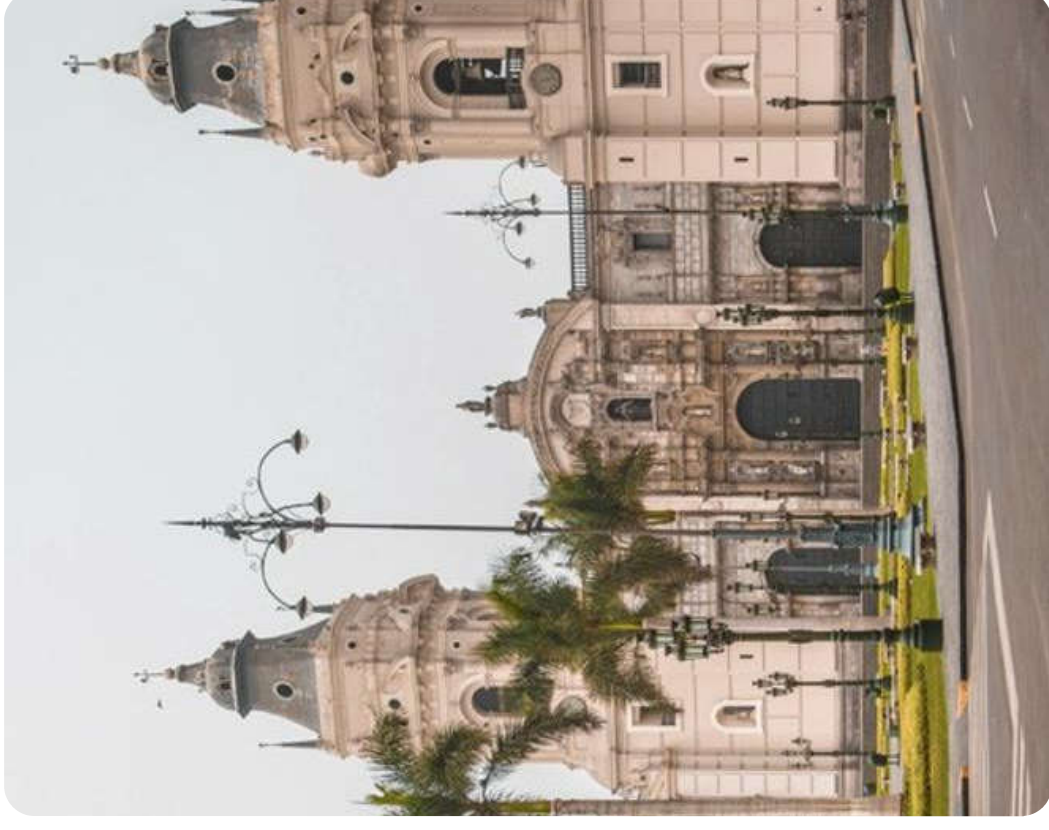

Colonial City Tour in Lima

Lima Cathedral, is located in the Plaza Mayor in the center of Lima and its construction began in 1535, the building has undergone many reconstructions and transformations but still maintains its colonial structure and facade.

Casa Aliaga located in the Historic Center of Lima, is the oldest in America. It was built by Jerónimo de Aliaga, one of the companions of the Spanish conquistador Francisco Pizarro who, with him, founded the city of Lima in 1535. From then until today, the descendants of Jerónimo de Aliaga have lived in this very house. Understandably transformed by earthquakes and changes in fashion, the mansion has stood for five centuries.

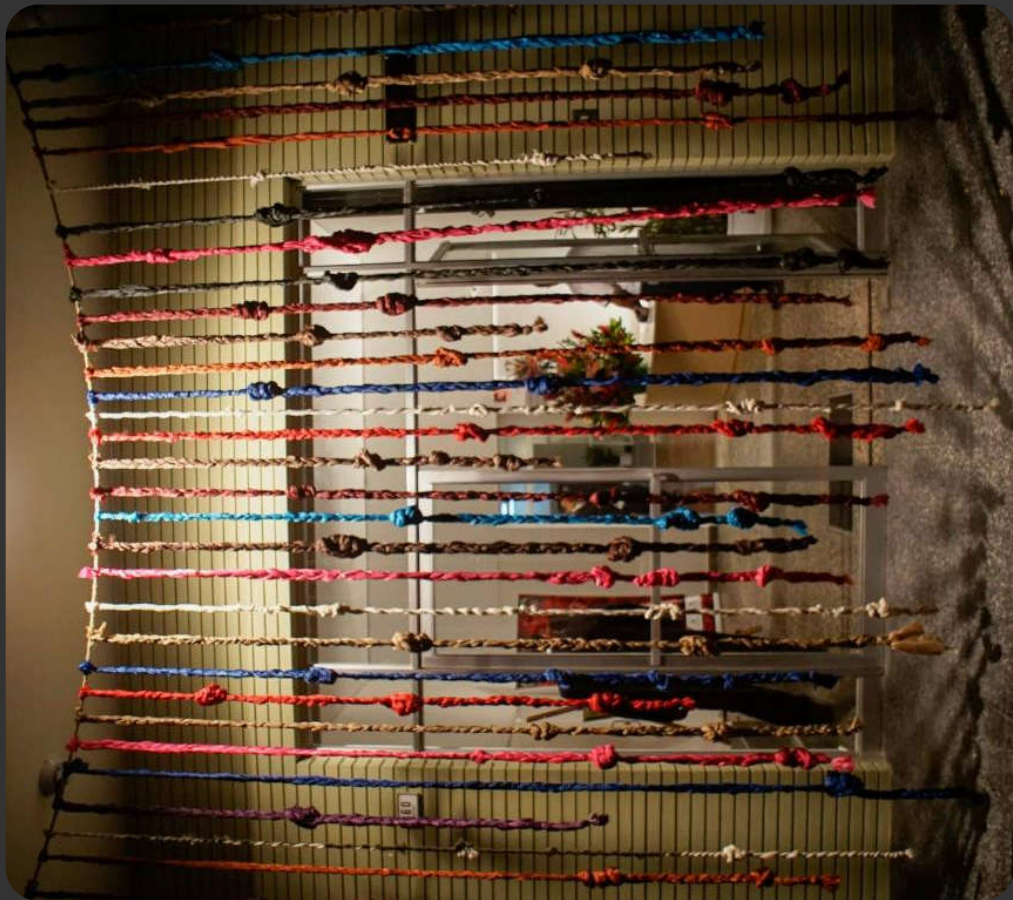
Amano Museum & Huaca Pucllana

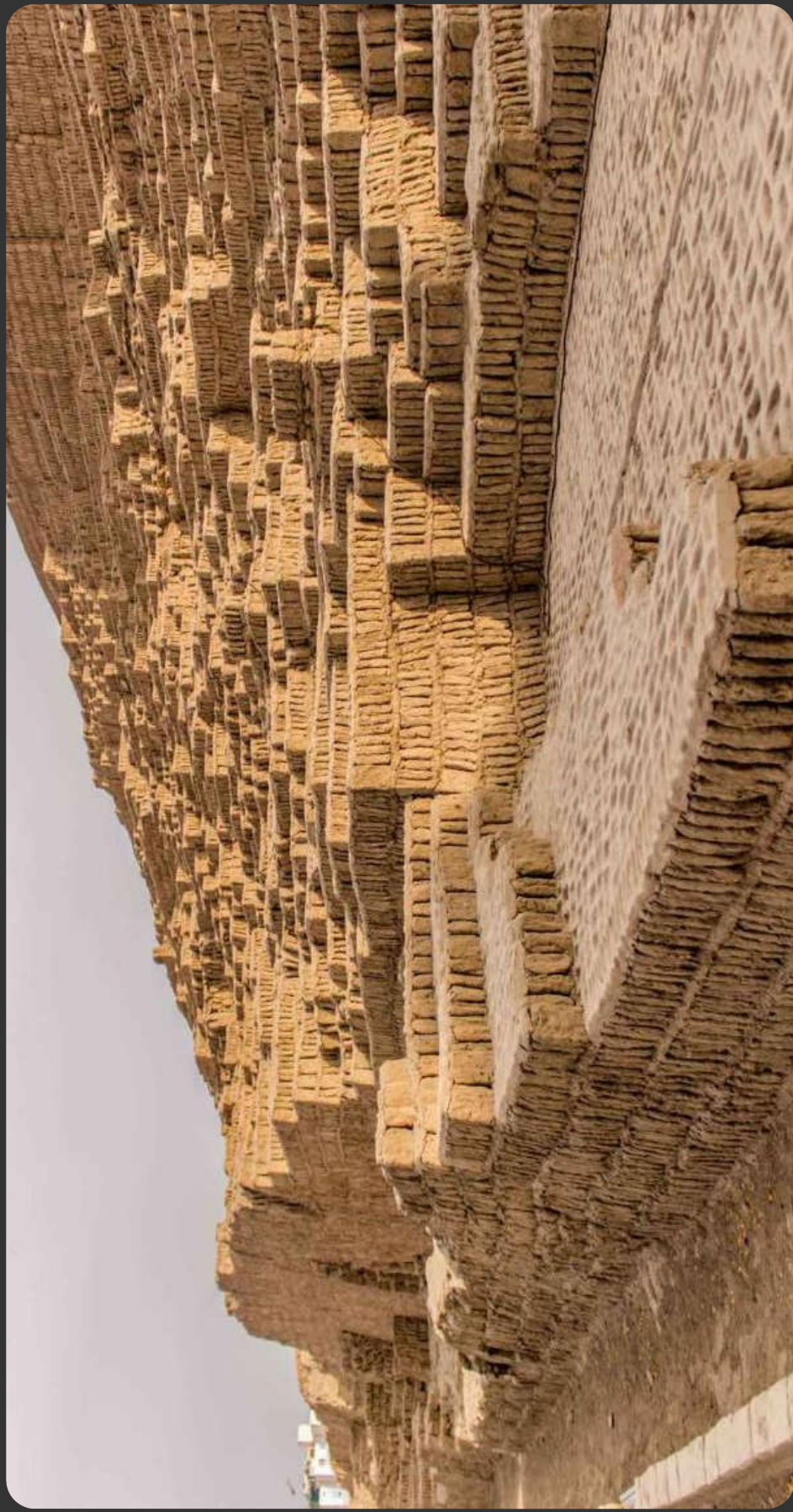
We will move to Miraflores and visit the Amano Museum, a revealing private collection that exhibits more than 500 pre-Columbian textiles from eleven cultures, among which those of the Chancay culture (900-1400 AD) stand out. The Amano Museum has a curious history, which is just over 50 years old. This impressive place was made possible thanks to a Japanese man named Yoshitaro Amano, a businessman who decided to take up his second passion: archaeology and began to carry out important excavations where he discovered important pieces, ceramics and textiles. He began to collect them. Over time and with hard work, he built the Amano Museum in 1961.

Later visit Huaca Pucllac'a is an ancient archaeological site that dates back to pre-Inca times. During this tour, visitors will explore its stone structures and learn about the culture and rituals of the people who once lived here. It is a great place to discover local history, enjoy panoramic views, and connect with Peru's ancestral past.

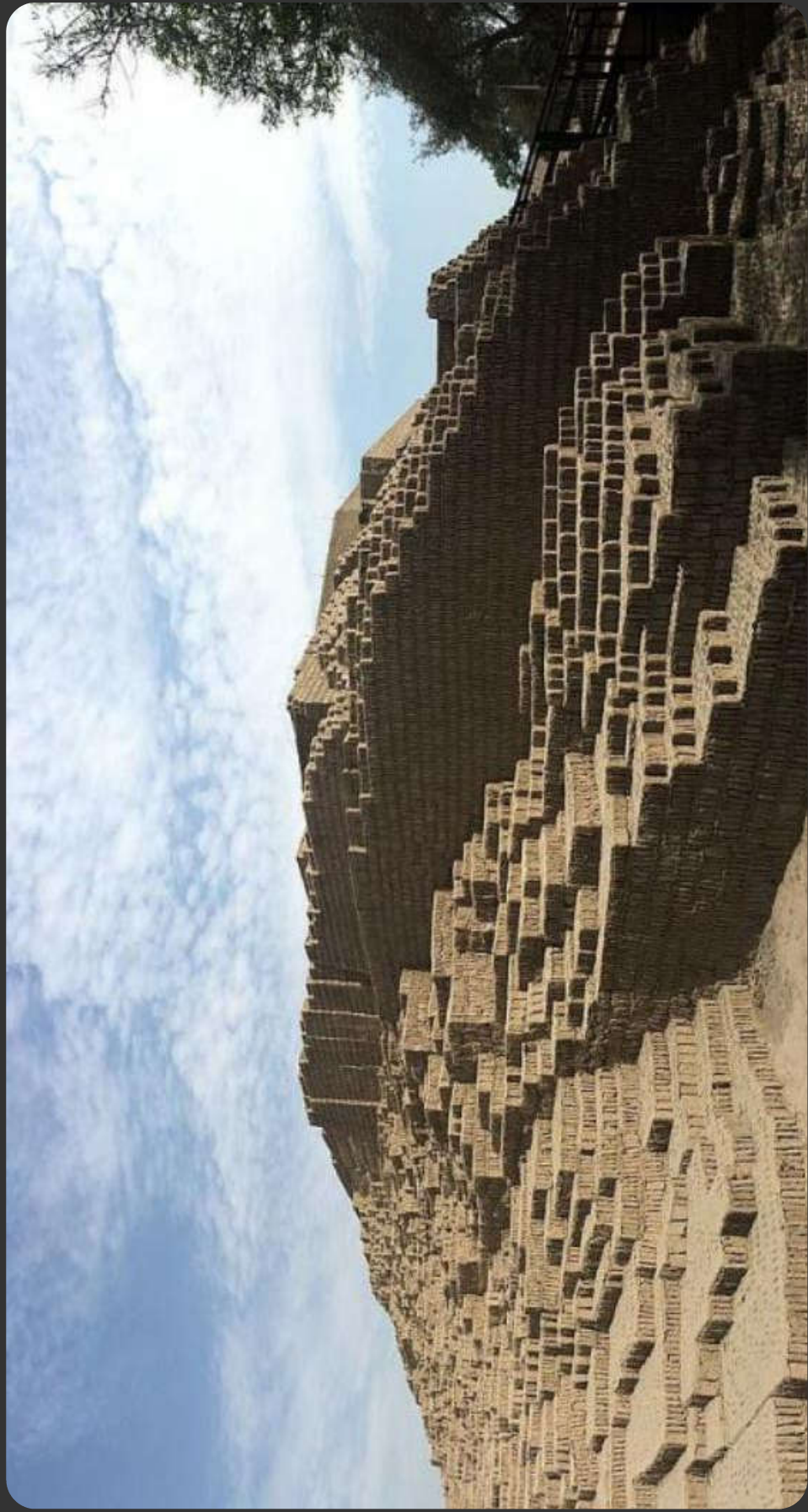
